

Care Instructions

Expert Tips for the Care of Wooden Products

Here at klotzaufklotz we aim to preserve the originality of the wood by finishing it with natural oil.

By doing so, we not only bring out the colour and grain of the wood but also protect it from dust, water and scratches.

Step 1: sanding (optional)

Oiled surfaces can be easily refinished by sanding them again before applying the finish.

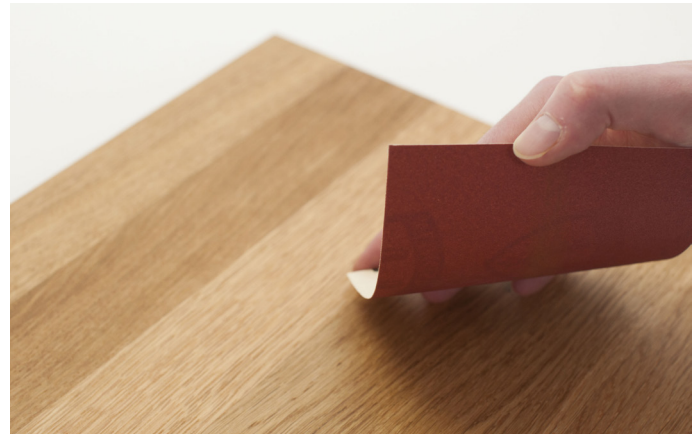
Step 2: preparing

The item must be clean and free from dust, grease or fluff. Just wipe it off with a soft, damp cotton rag and give it an hour to dry properly.

Which oil should I use?

Products that are used for preparing food should be finished with natural cooking oils such as thistle oil. With our other products we recommend finish that is suitable for wooden toys and fulfils the requirement norm 71-3.

As we promote sustainability, we recommend for you to refinish your product after some time of usage (6 months up to 2 years, depending on strain), if you wish to enjoy your purchase for years to come. Chopping boards are made for a day-to-day use and should be refinished on a monthly basis.



Caution: Always wear disposable gloves for this step and the following!

Step 3: rubbing in

Apply the finish on your product and rub it in with circular movements. The darker shade of wood indicates if you have finished the entire item. In case the oil disappears quickly, apply a little more on these spots.



Step 4: polishing

After 20-30 min, using a cotton rag, you rub in the extra finish with the wood grain.

Note: refrain from touching the wood with any other than the cotton rags as it might leave traces



Step 5: drying

Almost done - now let your product dry for 24 hours before you use it again.
